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PARSHAS BO

A frustrated man once entered the Chofetz Chaim's modest home with the following complaint: "Rabbi, I keep yelling at my son to learn, but to no avail. There is simply no point—he never listens!"

*The Chofetz Chaim responded, "You are incorrect that there is no point. He will **also** yell at his son to learn."*

This week's Torah portion begins with Hashem commanding Moshe to go to Pharaoh, so that Hashem may bring "*these signs of Mine in his midst*"—the plagues—upon Egypt.

What was the purpose of bringing these plagues? The very next verse explains: "*So that you may relate in the ears of your son and your son's son how I made a mockery of Egypt, and My signs that I placed among them—so that you may **know that I am Hashem.***"

In other words, the purpose of the plagues—and of the Exodus from Egypt itself—is to instill, for all future generations, the foundations of Emunah, faith, in Hashem.

Yet the verse also concludes with the words, "*that **you** may know that I am Hashem.*" The Torah here is teaching us one of the most fundamental principles of Jewish education: it must come from within, and it must be real.

If a person wishes to pass on Emunah to his children, it can only succeed if they themselves are deeply grounded in that faith. Accordingly, the end of the verse is *the condition* for the beginning of the verse: only if **you** truly know that I am Hashem will you be able to meaningfully relate it to your children.

Likewise, if a parent merely preaches Torah values to their children—"Learn! Pray!"—but does not personally feel them, live them, and act upon them, then their message will ring hollow. It is only when a person is genuinely growing and living by the Torah that it will organically spill over to the next generation.

May we all merit to "soak in" the sparks of faith from these Torah portions, and pass them on to all future generations.
